## **Ukraine**

### **Security Council Fails to Adopt Resolution Condemning Moscow's Referenda in Ukraine's Occupied Territories, as Permanent Member Employs Veto**

*Representative Calls 15-Member Organ 'Broken Pillar' of United Nations*

Meeting today following Russian Federation President Vladimir V. Putin's proclamation of Moscow's annexation of Luhansk, Donetsk, Kherson and Zaporizhzhia, the Security Council rejected a draft resolution intended to condemn the referenda that preceded it.

The draft, submitted by Albania and the United States, garnered support from 10 members but was vetoed by the Russian Federation. Brazil, China, Gabon and India all abstained.

Through the draft resolution, the 15-member Council would have also declared that the referenda taken on 23 to 27 September in parts of those regions are neither valid nor form the basis for any alteration of the status of these regions of Ukraine, including any purported annexation by the Russian Federation.

**The draft would also have the Council call on all States, international organizations and specialized agencies not to recognize any alteration of the status of these Ukrainian regions, nor any purported acquisition thereof by the Russian Federation.**

By other terms, the Council would have decided that the Russian Federation shall desist and refrain from actions aimed at the partial or total disruption of the national unity and territorial integrity of Ukraine in all areas within that country's internationally recognized borders.

**Further, the organ would have decided that the Russian Federation shall immediately cease its full-scale, unlawful invasion of Ukraine and immediately, completely and unconditionally withdraw all its military forces from the territory of Ukraine within its internationally recognized borders to enable a peaceful resolution of the conflict.**

Speaking before the vote, the representative of the United States recalled that some people have said that the process leading to this draft resolution was rushed, but stressed that "what was rushed was Russia's illegal act to annex Ukraine's territory". Underscoring that this issue is about collective security, she urged other Council members to vote in favour of the resolution in defence of international peace and security.

The representative of the Russian Federation, however, said that the Council has never adopted resolutions that directly condemn one of its members, adding that other Council members are pushing his delegation to use its veto so they can wax lyrical that the Russian Federation is abusing that right. "The results of the [referenda] speak for themselves — the residents of these regions do not

want to return to Ukraine,” he said, emphasizing that the referenda were carried out in full conformity with international law...

### **Update by the Chair of the Independent International Commission of Inquiry on Ukraine, at the 51st session of the Human Rights Council**

*Statements Multiple Mechanisms*

23 September 2022

*Distinguished President, Excellencies,*

Together with Ms. Jasminka Džumhur and Mr. Pablo de Greiff, I will present an update on the progress of the work of the Independent International Commission of Inquiry on Ukraine, in conformity with this Council’s resolution 49/1, adopted in March 2022.

Last time the Commissioners were present at the Human Rights Council was in May this year. The Council then requested the Commission, in resolution S-34/1, to address events that took place in late February and March 2022 in the areas of Kyiv, Chernihiv, Kharkiv and Sumy, and to brief the Council on the progress of that inquiry as part of its oral update in September. Consequently, we have so far mainly focused on events in those four regions.

**Tomorrow will mark seven months since the outset of the hostilities in Ukraine.** We are concerned by the suffering that the armed conflict in Ukraine has imposed on the civilian population. This is illustrated by the figures updated regularly by the OHCHR concerning deaths and injuries and by the UNHCR with respect to refugees and internally displaced persons. The recent discovery of yet additional graves illustrates the gravity of the situation.

Allow me first to make some general remarks.

The Commission has focused on events in view of their gravity, their significance in demonstrating patterns of alleged violations, and the possibility to gain access to victims, witnesses, and supporting documentation. It seeks to coordinate its efforts with the many entities carrying out investigations in order to avoid duplication and re-traumatization of victims.

**The security of victims is at the centre of our work, and we ensure a strict respect of the “do no harm” and confidentiality principles.** We would like to express our deep appreciation to victims and witnesses who have shared their stories.

The Commission, which is independent and impartial, has sought cooperation and dialogue with relevant Governments. We appreciate the access and cooperation extended to us by the Government of Ukraine. **Our attempts to engage in a constructive dialogue with Russian Federation authorities have, regretfully, so far not been successful, but we will persist in our efforts.**

*Distinguished President, Excellencies,*

I will now return to our investigations in the regions of Kyiv, Chernihiv, Kharkiv, and Sumy. The Commission has visited 27 towns and settlements and has interviewed more than 150 victims and witnesses. We have inspected sites of destruction, graves, places of detention and torture, as well as weapon remnants, and consulted a large number of documents and reports. The Commission met with Government authorities, international organisations, civil society, and other relevant stakeholders. Based on the evidence gathered by the Commission, it has concluded that war crimes have been committed in Ukraine.

The following is a sample of the findings and observations we have made thus far.

### ***Starting with the conduct of hostilities.***

Regarding the conduct of hostilities, the use of explosive weapons with wide area effects in populated areas is a source of immense harm and suffering for civilians. We observed first-hand the damage that explosive weapons have caused to residential buildings and infrastructure, including schools and hospitals. In Kharkiv city, explosive weapons devastated entire areas of the city.

We note that according to the Office of High Commissioner for Human Rights, most of the recorded deaths were caused by the use of such weapons. This devastation is one of the factors explaining why a third of the Ukrainian population has been forced to flee. One older woman, who fled as hostilities raged in Kharkiv area, told us: "I don't live, I just exist; I have nothing left in my soul."

### ***Indiscriminate attacks***

A number of the attacks we investigated had been carried out without distinguishing between civilians and combatants. This included some attacks with cluster munitions or multi-launch rocket systems and airstrikes in populated areas.

**As for violations against personal integrity, we were struck by the large number of executions in the areas that we visited. The Commission is currently investigating such deaths in 16 towns and settlements.** We have received credible allegations regarding many more cases of executions, which we are documenting further.

Common elements of such crimes include the prior detention of the victims as well as visible signs of executions on bodies, such as hands tied behind backs, gunshot wounds to the head, and slit throats. Witnesses provided us with consistent accounts of ill-treatment and torture, which were carried out during unlawful confinement. Some of the victims reported that after initial detention by Russian forces in Ukraine, they were transferred to the Russian Federation and held for weeks in prisons. Interlocutors described beatings, electric shocks, and forced nudity, as well as other types of violations in such detention facilities. After being reportedly transferred into detention in the Russian Federation, some victims have disappeared.

As regard these four areas, we have processed two incidents of ill-treatment against Russian Federation soldiers by Ukrainian forces. While few in numbers, such cases continue to be the subject of our attention.

### ***Sexual and gender-based violence***

Investigating cases related to sexual and gender-based violence present specific challenges. The Commission has found that some Russian Federation soldiers committed such crimes. These acts amounted to different types of violations of rights, including sexual violence, torture, and cruel and inhuman treatment. There are examples of cases where relatives were forced to witness the crimes. In the cases we have investigated, the age of victims of sexual and gendered-based violence ranged from four to 82 years.

**The Commission has documented cases in which children have been raped, tortured, and unlawfully confined.** Children have also been killed and injured in indiscriminate attacks with explosive weapons. The exposure to repeated explosions, crimes, forced displacement and separation from family members deeply affected their well-being and mental health.

*Distinguished President, Excellencies,*

The Commission will continue its inquiry related to the four regions mentioned in the resolution of May 2022 and will gradually devote more of its resources to its general mandate in the first resolution, which is both geographically and thematically broader. Issues of interest will include filtration camps, alleged forced transfer of people, and the conditions under which expedited adoption of children are allegedly taking place.

**In this brief update we have concentrated mainly on violations against personal integrity. Depending on the availability of evidence, the Commission will seek to investigate other types of violations, including the destruction of civilian infrastructure; the appropriation or destruction of economic resources; violations of the right to food; and the legality of changes in local administration,** which may have far-reaching consequences. In addition to making recommendations regarding criminal accountability, the Commission will, consistent with its victim-centered approach, make recommendations about other dimensions of accountability, to which victims also have rights.

We look forward to further cooperation with all relevant actors to pursue the task entrusted to us by the Human Rights Council.

## **Human Rights Defenders**

### **Human rights: EU increases support to the protection of human rights defenders worldwide**

*Press release* 29 September 2022

Human rights are increasingly under threat worldwide. Against this global backdrop, reconfirming the European Union's strong support to human rights, fundamental freedoms and democracy, and their defenders worldwide, **Commissioner Jutta Urpilainen today signed €30 million, a substantial increase, for the new phase of the EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism,** in the presence of civil society organisations and human rights defenders, for the period 2022–2027.

Commissioner for International Partnerships, Jutta Urpilainen, said: "The EU stands for human rights, fundamental freedoms and democracy worldwide. Human rights defenders are the EU's key partners in making human rights a reality on the ground. Today, their lives are increasingly at risk because of intensifying crackdowns on fundamental rights and freedoms. These courageous individuals defending

universal rights, including in the most dangerous and difficult of contexts, can count on the support of the European Union. The EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism will continue to save lives, protect human rights defenders, and support human rights work. I am proud to have signed today a commitment to significantly increase its funding – €30 million for the next four and a half years.”

### ***EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism***

The EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism is a critical EU programme for supporting human rights defenders around the world, **a key priority of the €1.5 billion Global Europe Human Rights and Democracy programme**. The Mechanism is managed by [ProtectDefenders.eu](https://protectdefenders.eu), a consortium of 12 human rights NGOs.

**The additional funds will enable [ProtectDefenders.eu](https://protectdefenders.eu) to provide more at-risk human rights defenders with efficient, strategic and flexible support** in the immediate-, medium- and long-term, including:

- Physical and digital protection, legal and medical support, trial and prison monitoring;
- Capacity development, advocacy, outreach, training on risk prevention and security, development of strategies (to counter restrictions, sanctions, defamation, or laws that seek to criminalise their work), situation monitoring and early warning;
- Temporary relocation schemes in the EU and at regional or local level;
- More focus on women, young, LGBTIQ and environmental rights defenders.

In 2021, the EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism saw an unprecedented increase in requests for urgent protective support from individuals and organisations confronting security threats. [ProtectDefenders.eu](https://protectdefenders.eu) **delivered life-saving support and multi-faceted assistance to nearly 8,700 most at-risk human rights defenders and grassroots human rights organisations – 23% more than in 2020 – in 103 countries including in Belarus, Myanmar and Afghanistan.**

Since 2015, the EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism has assisted over 55,000 human rights defenders and their family members at risk in over 120 countries thanks to EU funding of €35 million during its first two phases. **While over half of the beneficiaries are women and sexual minority human rights defenders, an increasing number of environmental, land and indigenous peoples' rights defenders receive support.**

In its new phase, the EU Human Rights Defenders Mechanism will incorporate the EU Emergency Fund for Human Rights Defenders at Risk. This EU Emergency Fund, which is managed by the Commission in close cooperation with the European External Action Service, **provides emergency grants of up to €10,000 to human rights defenders and their families. Since 2014, the Emergency Fund has supported approximately 1,600 human rights defenders and their family members from about 100 countries.**

### *Abstract*

- UNAIDS and a broad range of partners have collaborated to establish a new set of HIV prevention targets to be achieved by 2025 as an intermediate step towards the sustainable development target for 2030.
- The number of new HIV infections in the world continues to decline, in part due to the extraordinary expansion of effective HIV treatment. However, the decline is geographically heterogeneous, with some regions reporting a rise in incidence. The incidence target that was agreed for 2020 has been missed.
- A range of exciting new HIV prevention technologies have become available or are in the pipeline but will only have an impact if they are accessible and affordable and delivered within systems that take full account of the social and political context in which most infections occur. Most new infections occur in populations that are marginalised or discriminated against due to structural, legal, and cultural barriers.
- The new targets imply a new approach to HIV prevention that emphasises appropriate, person-centred, prioritised, effective, combination HIV prevention within a framework that reduces existing barriers to services and acknowledges heterogeneity, autonomy, and choice.
- These targets have consequences for people working in HIV programmes both for delivery and for monitoring and evaluation, for health planners setting local and national priorities, and for funders both domestic and global. Most importantly, they have consequences for people who are at risk of HIV exposure and infection.
- Achieving these targets will have a huge impact on the future of the HIV epidemic and put us back on track towards ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2030.

## **Health –Immunization/Vaccine Development**

### **[Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation Announces New Commitments for Vaccine Candidates With the Potential to Reduce Newborn and Infant Deaths in Lower-Income Countries](#)**

SEATTLE, September 28, 2022 – Today, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced **grants totaling nearly US\$128 million to support the development and accessibility of maternal vaccines for Group B Streptococcus (GBS) and Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), two of the leading causes of death for newborns and young infants in lower-income countries.**

No vaccines currently exist for these infections and treatment is too often out of reach in lower-income settings. These vaccines are being developed by Pfizer and, if successful and approved, would represent a significant advancement in the maternal immunization space. The GBS vaccine candidate could also be the first vaccine developed with a primary purpose for use during pregnancy to prevent infections in newborns and young infants. The foundation grants will fund work to help ensure the vaccines are accessible to pregnant women living in lower-income countries...

“Maternal immunization—vaccinating pregnant women who can then pass on lifesaving protection to their babies—is a powerful way to reduce newborn and infant mortality,” said Keith Klugman, director, pneumonia at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. “However, for decades, innovation in this area has been underprioritized and underfunded, putting babies unnecessarily at risk for preventable infections. **We are hopeful our investments in this promising pipeline of new maternal vaccines,**

**including these two grants, will help infants in low-income settings have the best chance at life.”...**

“If successful and approved or licensed, Pfizer’s vaccine candidates against GBS and RSV could have a profound impact on the health of young infants at a time when they are most vulnerable against these potentially devastating infections, particularly in lower-income countries where prevalence is higher,” said Annaliesa Anderson, Ph.D., senior vice president and chief scientific officer, vaccine research and development, Pfizer. “As part of Pfizer’s Accord for a Healthier World program focused on establishing access to our medicines and vaccines on a not-for-profit basis, the support for the vaccine candidates from the Gates Foundation will enable faster and more equitable deployment of the vaccines to these regions.”...

**A \$100 million grant will support the manufacturing of Pfizer’s GBS vaccine for Phase 3 clinical trials and, if successful, World Health Organization prequalification.** It will also help fund the development of an affordable multidose vial for delivery of the vaccine in lower-income countries via public-sector purchasers, including Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance. This grant builds on a previous foundation investment for \$17 million to help support Pfizer’s Phase 1/2 clinical trials that are exploring if protective antibodies could be transferred from immunized mothers to their babies.

**A \$27.5 million grant to Pfizer will support the development of an affordable multidose vial for delivery of the RSV vaccine candidate in lower-income countries via public sector purchasers, including Gavi.** The work is co-funded by Pfizer and will include feasibility studies, clinical trial material manufacturing, and a trial to confirm that the multidose vial packaging designed for use in lower-income countries is comparable with what is used in high-income country markets.

**Both grants are anchored in the principles of the Gates Foundation’s [Global Access Policy](#), which ensures that knowledge generated from these efforts can be promptly and broadly disseminated and any resulting products be made available and accessible at an affordable price to the world’s poorest.**

The Gates Foundation has committed nearly \$540 million to maternal immunization efforts over the last 15 years, with an approach that focuses on evidence generation, product development and implementation. In addition to funding research and development for GBS and RSV, the foundation has supported the advancement of other maternal vaccines to prevent influenza, whooping cough and newborn bloodstream infections caused by bacteria other than GBS. Through foundation support and the collaboration of partners and grantees around the world, there’s hope that more women and their babies in lower-income countries will have access to lifesaving tools that can protect against key vaccine-preventable diseases.




### **Weekly epidemiological update on COVID-19 – 28 September 2022**

#### *Overview*

Globally, the number of new weekly cases decreased by 11% during the week of 19 to 25 September 2022, as compared to the previous week, with over three million new cases reported. The number of new weekly deaths decreased by 18%, as compared to the previous week, with just over 8900 fatalities reported.

As of 25 September 2022, 612 million confirmed cases and 6.5 million deaths have been reported globally.

#### **[Polio eradication: falling at the final hurdle?](#)**

The past 3 years have seen remarkable developments in the effort to eradicate polio. In 2019, global eradication of type 3 poliovirus was declared. In 2020, Africa was classified as free from endemic polio. Wild poliovirus was confined to pockets of Afghanistan and Pakistan. **But optimism is receding.**

**Polio has returned to many parts of the world, and the upcoming replenishment to fund the eradication initiative comes amid geopolitical crises and global economic difficulties. The final stages of eradication have long been stuttering. Will 2022 be the year it finally slips away?**

The epidemiological situation is concerning. COVID-19 temporarily halted the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI)'s immunisation campaigns, putting over 80 million children at risk. Consequently, outbreaks of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus (cVDPV) tripled from 2019 to 2020, with over 1100 children paralysed. Paralysis caused by wild poliovirus in Malawi in late 2021 marked a return of the virus to Africa. In 2022, cVDPVs have been detected in wastewater in the USA, UK, and Israel, although rapid vaccination campaigns should prevent them becoming an immediate threat to public health. Nigeria has faced a large outbreak of 415 cVDPV cases. PAHO has warned that Brazil, Dominican Republic, Haiti, and Peru are at high risk for reintroduction of polio, following dwindling vaccination rates. Global polio immunisation rates fell to 80% in 2021, the lowest rate in 14 years.

**GPEI's immediate concern is money. At a pledging event in October in Germany, it will ask for US\$4.8 billion from partners and donor countries, and for political commitment to eradicate polio by 2026.** The strategy for 2022–26, if funded, will see the vaccination of 370 million children annually and continued surveillance for polio and other diseases in 50 countries. But will donors be willing? Among economic instability, cost-of-living crises, and concerns over fragmentation of global health financing, governments might not see polio as important. As outlined in a World Report, the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria failed to reach its recent fundraising target. Traditional global health entities are seemingly no longer the political priorities they once were.

In its latest report, the GPEI's Independent Monitoring Board has warned that any recent optimism "must be tempered by some cold realities". Although there have been reductions in cases in Pakistan and Afghanistan, widespread flooding in Pakistan has put health-care delivery at risk. Vaccinations have restarted in Afghanistan, following the near breakdown of the entire health system after the Taliban's return to power; in February, eight vaccination workers were killed. The Board emphasises the need to engage with and secure commitments from local governments in wild poliovirus' last strongholds.

**Novel polio vaccines should help control outbreaks of cVDPV and reduce the risk of new cases.** A novel oral polio type 2 vaccine, using a more genetically stable virus strain, has been given emergency authorisation by WHO. Data on its performance are being collected with the goal of full licensure, and potential use outside outbreak settings. But novel vaccines have been in short supply and technical solutions alone are not enough to overcome barriers to eradication.

In fact, the fundamental aims of the eradication programme have been questioned. Writing in *The Lancet Global Health*, Konstantin Chumakov and colleagues argued that GPEI should refocus on eradicating poliomyelitis as a disease, rather than eradicating the virus itself. Others have urged the programme to consider the eradication goal unobtainable and focus instead on sustained control of cases. Aidan O'Leary, Director for Polio Eradication at WHO, writes in *The Lancet* that, "While previous deadlines have come and gone, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative's 2022–2026 strategy has sharpened its approach to overcoming the remaining hurdles to eradication in the highest risk communities around the world". **But it is reasonable to ask whether the dedication of huge amounts of money and effort to a vertical health programme for a single disease is fair.**

The GPEI has done indisputable good. Since its launch in 1988, it has overseen a 99.9% reduction in the global incidence of polio, saved more than 1.5 million lives, and spared an estimated 16 million people from paralysis. Two of the three serotypes of wild poliovirus (types 2 and 3) have been certified as eradicated worldwide. These are huge achievements. But the GPEI faces clear challenges that once again threaten the viability of the eradication programme. One thing is certain: a global resurgence of polio would be disastrous for health.

### *Abstract*

- UNAIDS and a broad range of partners have collaborated to establish a new set of HIV prevention targets to be achieved by 2025 as an intermediate step towards the sustainable development target for 2030.
- The number of new HIV infections in the world continues to decline, in part due to the extraordinary expansion of effective HIV treatment. However, the decline is geographically heterogeneous, with some regions reporting a rise in incidence. The incidence target that was agreed for 2020 has been missed.
- A range of exciting new HIV prevention technologies have become available or are in the pipeline but will only have an impact if they are accessible and affordable and delivered within systems that take full account of the social and political context in which most infections occur. Most new infections occur in populations that are marginalised or discriminated against due to structural, legal, and cultural barriers.
- The new targets imply a new approach to HIV prevention that emphasises appropriate, person-centred, prioritised, effective, combination HIV prevention within a framework that reduces existing barriers to services and acknowledges heterogeneity, autonomy, and choice.
- These targets have consequences for people working in HIV programmes both for delivery and for monitoring and evaluation, for health planners setting local and national priorities, and for funders both domestic and global. Most importantly, they have consequences for people who are at risk of HIV exposure and infection.
- Achieving these targets will have a huge impact on the future of the HIV epidemic and put us back on track towards ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2030.
