Nobel Peace Prize Announcement – Full text

Announcement

The Norwegian Nobel Committee has decided to award the Nobel Peace Prize for 2022 to one individual and two organisations.

The Peace Prize laureates represent civil society in their home countries. They have for many years promoted the right to criticise power and protect the fundamental rights of citizens. They have made an outstanding effort to document war crimes, human right abuses and the abuse of power. Together they demonstrate the significance of civil society for peace and democracy.

This year's Peace Prize is awarded to human rights advocate Ales Bialiatski from Belarus, the Russian human rights organisation Memorial and the Ukrainian human rights organisation Center for Civil Liberties.

Ales Bialiatski was one of the initiators of the democracy movement that emerged in Belarus in the mid-1980s. He has devoted his life to promoting democracy and peaceful development in his home country. Among other things, he founded the organisation Viasna (Spring) in 1996 in response to the controversial constitutional amendments that gave the president dictatorial powers and that triggered widespread demonstrations. Viasna provided support for the jailed demonstrators and their families. In the years that followed, Viasna evolved into a broad-based human rights organisation that documented and protested against the authorities' use of torture against political prisoners.

Government authorities have repeatedly sought to silence Ales Bialiatski. He was imprisoned from 2011 to 2014. Following large-scale demonstrations against the regime in 2020, he was again arrested. He is still detained without trial. Despite tremendous personal hardship, Mr Bialiatski has not yielded an inch in his fight for human rights and democracy in Belarus.

The human rights organisation Memorial was established in 1987 by human rights activists in the former Soviet Union who wanted to ensure that the victims of the communist regime's oppression would never be forgotten. Nobel Peace Prize laureate [Andrei Sakharov](#) and human rights advocate Svetlana Gannushkina were among the founders. Memorial is based on the notion that confronting past crimes is essential in preventing new ones.

After the collapse of the Soviet Union, Memorial grew to become the largest human rights organisation in Russia. In addition to establishing a centre of documentation on victims of the Stalinist era, Memorial compiled and systematised information on political oppression and human rights violations in Russia. Memorial became the most authoritative source of information on political prisoners in Russian

detention facilities. The organisation has also been standing at the forefront of efforts to combat militarism and promote human rights and government based on rule of law.

When civil society must give way to autocracy and dictatorship, peace is often the next victim. During the Chechen wars, Memorial gathered and verified information on abuses and war crimes perpetrated on the civilian population by Russian and pro-Russian forces. In 2009, the head of Memorial's branch in Chechnya, Natalia Estemirova, was killed because of this work.

Civil society actors in Russia have been subjected to threats, imprisonment, disappearance and murder for many years. As part of the government's harassment of Memorial, the organisation was stamped early on as a "foreign agent". In December 2021, the authorities decided that Memorial was to be forcibly liquidated and the documentation centre was to be closed permanently. The closures became effective in the following months, but the people behind Memorial refuse to be shut down. In a comment on the forced dissolution, chairman Yan Rachinsky stated, "Nobody plans to give up."

The Center for Civil Liberties was founded in Kyiv in 2007 for the purpose of advancing human rights and democracy in Ukraine. The center has taken a stand to strengthen Ukrainian civil society and pressure the authorities to make Ukraine a full-fledged democracy. To develop Ukraine into a state governed by rule of law, Center for Civil Liberties has actively advocated that Ukraine become affiliated with the International Criminal Court.

After Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, Center for Civil Liberties has engaged in efforts to identify and document Russian war crimes against the Ukrainian civilian population. In collaboration with international partners, the center is playing a pioneering role with a view to holding the guilty parties accountable for their crimes.

By awarding the Nobel Peace Prize for 2022 to Ales Bialiatski, Memorial and the Center for Civil Liberties, the Norwegian Nobel Committee wishes to honour three outstanding champions of human rights, democracy and peaceful co-existence in the neighbour countries Belarus, Russia and Ukraine. Through their consistent efforts in favour of humanist values, anti-militarism and principles of law, this year's laureates have revitalised and honoured Alfred Nobel's vision of peace and fraternity between nations – a vision most needed in the world today.

Haiti – Cholera

UN humanitarian relief fund allocates US\$7 million to jumpstart response as at least 12 cholera cases are confirmed

(New York, 7 October 2022) **At least 12 cholera cases have been confirmed in Haiti, after three years with no recorded cases, raising concerns of a wider outbreak.** To help launch an immediate response and stem the spread of cholera, the United Nations Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) today allocated \$7 million for UN agencies and their partners to provide urgent life-saving assistance.

"We must stand with the people of Haiti in their hour of need," said Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator Martin Griffiths. "Cholera is preventable and

treatable. Left unchecked, however, an outbreak could lead to cataclysmic levels of despair for the people of Haiti, who are already enduring tremendous suffering. We cannot allow the gains made in past years in the fight against cholera to be jeopardized.”

The ongoing fuel blockade is severely crippling the functioning of and access to health, water and other basic services at a time when Haitian communities need them most.

Humanitarian agencies have appealed for the immediate opening of a humanitarian corridor to allow the release of fuel.

As of 6 October, in addition to the confirmed cholera cases, there are 152 suspected cases, 107 hospitalizations and 4 deaths. The outbreak is spreading beyond the capital Port-au-Prince.

The CERF funds released today will be earmarked for the World Health Organization (WHO) and the UN Children’s Fund (UNICEF) to urgently scale up health and sanitation efforts in support of the Government’s response, as well as to the UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS) to ensure continued logistical support for life-saving operations.

Global Progress in Reducing Extreme Poverty Grinds to a Halt

By 2030, Nearly 600 Million People Will Struggle on Less Than \$2.15 a Day

WASHINGTON, Oct. 5, 2022—The world is unlikely to meet the goal of ending extreme poverty by 2030 absent history-defying rates of economic growth over the remainder of this decade, according to a new World Bank study. The study finds that COVID-19 dealt the biggest setback to global poverty-reduction efforts since 1990 and the war in Ukraine threatens to make matters worse...

The Bank’s latest [*Poverty and Shared Prosperity Report*](#) provides the first comprehensive look at the global landscape of poverty in the aftermath of the extraordinary series of shocks to the global economy over the past few years. It estimates that the pandemic pushed about 70 million people into extreme poverty in 2020, the largest one-year increase since global poverty monitoring began in 1990. As a result, an estimated 719 million people subsisted on less than \$2.15 a day by the end of 2020...

Main Messages

Poverty and Shared Prosperity 2022: Correcting Course provides the first comprehensive analysis of the pandemic’s toll on poverty in developing countries..

The COVID-19 pandemic dealt the biggest setback to global poverty in decades. The pandemic increased the global extreme poverty rate to an estimated 9.3 percent in 2020—up from 8.4 percent in 2019. That indicates that more than 70 million people were pushed into extreme poverty by the end of 2020, increasing the global total to over 700 million.

2020 marked a historic turning point—an era of global income convergence gave way to global divergence. The world's poorest people bore the steepest costs of the pandemic. Incomes in the poorest countries fell much more than incomes in rich countries. As a result, the income losses of the world's poorest were twice as high as the world's richest, and global inequality rose for the first time in decades.

The poorest also suffered disproportionately in many other areas that directly affect their well-being. For example, they faced large setbacks in health and education, with devastating consequences, including premature mortality and pronounced learning losses. These setbacks, if left unaddressed by policy action, will have lasting consequences for people's lifetime income prospects.

The economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic has been uneven. The richest economies have recovered from the pandemic at a much faster pace than low- and middle income economies. Rising food and energy prices—fueled by climate shocks and conflict among the world's biggest food producers—have hindered a swift recovery. By the end of 2022, as many as 685 million people could still be living in extreme poverty. This would make 2022 the second-worst year for poverty reduction in the past two decades (after 2020).

These setbacks occurred when the speed of progress toward poverty reduction was already slowing. In the five years leading up to the pandemic, poverty reduction had slowed to 0.6 percentage point per year. Before 2020, the world was already significantly off course on the global goal of ending extreme poverty by 2030. This report projects that 7 percent of the world's population—roughly 574 million people—will still struggle in extreme poverty in 2030. That is far short of the global goal of 3 percent in 2030. Further, the report shows that in 2019 nearly half of the world's population (47 percent) lives in poverty when this is measured as living on less than US\$6.85 a day.

These setbacks call for a major course correction. Despite difficult global and domestic circumstances, policy makers must redouble their efforts to grow their economies in the coming years—while paying careful attention to who benefits from that growth. The need for growth that boosts the incomes of the poorest could not be greater than it is today.

Resilient recovery will depend on a wide range of policies. This report focuses on fiscal policy—a key area at the center of pandemic and postpandemic responses. Fiscal policy concerns how governments raise revenue and spend public resources. This report offers new analysis on how fiscal policy was used during the first year of the pandemic. It also sheds light on the impact of taxes, transfers, and subsidies on poverty and inequality in 94 countries before 2020, providing important new insights into the impacts of fiscal policy—not only during crises but also during normal conditions.

Fiscal policy made a noticeable difference in reducing the pandemic's impact on poverty. Without it, the average poverty rate in developing economies, assessed at national poverty lines, would have been 2.4 percentage points higher than it was. Yet fiscal policy was much less protective in poorer economies than in richer ones. Most high-income economies fully offset the pandemic's impacts on poverty through the use of fiscal policy, and upper-middle-income economies offset one-half of the impact. However, low- and lower-middle-income economies offset only one-quarter of the impact. The differences in effectiveness reflected more limited access to finance, weaker delivery systems, and higher levels of informality, which made protecting jobs much more challenging.

In general, low- and middle-income economies tend to be less successful than high-income ones in ensuring that the combination of taxes, transfers, and subsidies benefit the poor. Taxes finance spending on core services and investments, and transfers and subsidies can offset

their impact on household incomes. But in two-thirds of low- and middle-income economies, the income of poor households falls by the time taxes have been paid and transfers and subsidies have been received. This divergence is due in part to the larger share of the informal sector in those economies. As a consequence, taxes are predominantly collected indirectly—through sales and excise taxes—and income transfers are often too low to compensate.

Given these structural challenges, **this report identifies three key priority actions for fiscal policy in the coming years, as countries work to correct course:**

1. Reorient spending away from subsidies toward support targeted to poor and vulnerable groups. Subsidies are often poorly targeted. For example, one-half of all spending on energy subsidies in low- and middle-income economies goes to the richest 20 percent of the population, who consume more energy. In contrast, programs like targeted cash transfers are far more likely to reach poor and vulnerable groups. More than 60 percent of spending on cash transfers goes to the bottom 40 percent. Cash transfers also tend to have a larger impact on income growth than subsidies.

2. Increase public investment that supports long-run development. Some of the highest value public spending—such as investments in the human capital of young people or investments in infrastructure and research and development—can have a beneficial impact on growth, inequality, or poverty decades later. Amid crises, it is difficult to protect such investments, but it is essential to do so. The COVID-19 pandemic has shown that hardwon progress achieved over decades can suddenly vanish. Designing forward-looking fiscal policies today can help countries to be better prepared and protected against future crises.

3. Mobilize revenue without hurting the poor. This can be accomplished through property and carbon taxes and by making personal and corporate income taxes more progressive. If indirect taxes need to be raised, cash transfers can be simultaneously used to offset their effects on the most vulnerable households.

Reforming fiscal policy will be an essential element of correcting course, but we must be realistic about how much we can expect it to do. Despite the promise of fiscal reforms, simulations suggest it will take heroic efforts toward more effective fiscal policy choices to restore the pandemic-related losses in the next four to five years. Successful fiscal reform will require the support of sufficiently powerful domestic coalitions interested in pursuing these types of policy goals, as well as stepped-up global cooperation.

Accelerating global poverty reduction, and progress toward the Sustainable Development Goals, will require more comprehensive policy action. This will involve a broader set of policies to stimulate the kind of growth that can benefit people across all income levels—but particularly those at the bottom. Correcting course is both urgent and difficult. Even if the course correction proves insufficient to end extreme poverty by 2030, it must begin now—for the sake of a lasting recovery from the overlapping crises of today.

[**Ford Foundation Launches \\$80 Million Initiative to Bolster Civil Society in the Global South**](#)

"Weaving Resilience" initiative will address the constriction of civic space by networking organizations to provide localized strategic assistance to nonprofit organizations across Asia, Africa, and Latin America.

New York, NY - October 4, 2022 — The Ford Foundation today announced an \$80 million program to build the resilience of civil society organizations in the Global South. Developed with partners in eight regions in Asia, Africa, and Latin America, ***Weaving Resilience will strengthen and connect civil society organizations and movements on the frontlines of the fight for social justice.***

The initiative lays the groundwork for interrelated yet localized resource hubs in **Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Indonesia, Kenya, Lebanon, Mexico, Nigeria, Peru, South Africa, Tanzania, and Uganda** so that organizations can empower each other with the expertise and tools they need to build and sustain social change. Regional organizations will house and lead the hubs, so leadership comes directly from affected communities instead of from the Global North. Additionally, a handful of cross-regional and global organizations will provide similar services from their regional offices.

"At the Ford Foundation, we believe that the people closest to a problem are also closest to its solution. We must listen to and learn from the individuals, communities, and organizations who have been courageously leading the way for years—particularly in the Global South, where civil society operates with insufficient resources, and yet, their resilience is more important than ever," said Darren Walker, president of the Ford Foundation.

Across the world, especially in the Global South, there has been a rise in authoritarianism and a compounding decrease in democratic values, which are collectively deepening inequality. **Since March 2020, 155 countries have placed new restrictions on public assemblies, while barely 3% of the world's population lives in countries that are considered to have open civic space.**

The resource hubs will become centers of excellence for civil society resilience in their respective regions, providing strategic assistance and guidance on security and institutional adaptability. Each will be grounded in its unique local context, meeting the greatest areas of need for the continuance of civil society: institutional resilience, strategic relevance, and holistic well-being...

Using Quantum Computers and Simulators in the Life Sciences: Current Trends and Future Prospects

We analysed the research landscape associated with the application of quantum technologies to the life sciences, highlighting current developments, opportunities and challenges, initiatives, and activities to help enable the ecosystem in the future.

Quantum technologies are expected to lead to new products and services having potentially transformative impacts across many sectors. However, despite the numerous opportunities, the

development and application of quantum technologies also pose several challenges that will need to be addressed if the benefits of the technologies are to be fully realised.

This report analyses the landscape associated with the development and adoption of quantum technologies in the life sciences sector with a particular focus on quantum computers and quantum simulators. **Through a detailed literature review, interviews with a range of stakeholders and a comprehensive scientometric analysis, the work examines the key trends and the challenges and opportunities associated with the application of quantum computers and simulators to the life sciences.** The work synthesizes evidence — both qualitative and quantitative — on various aspects associated with the global quantum computers and simulators and life sciences research ecosystem including growing research areas and key countries, institutions, companies and funders that are engaged in emerging quantum computer and simulator research. The research presented in this report will be of interest to a range of stakeholders including those in academia and industry, policymakers and more generally to anyone interested in the development, adoption and impact of emerging technologies.

Research Questions

- What are the current developments associated with the application of quantum computers and simulators to the life sciences?
- What are the potential opportunities and challenges associated with the application of quantum computers and simulators to the life sciences?
- How are initiatives (including policy measures, strategies, actions and plans) being adopted globally to strengthen the quantum technology research and innovation ecosystem?

Key Findings

- With widespread interest in its long-term disruptive potential as a technology, there is a great deal of activity taking place across the globe relating to quantum technologies. Our analysis of global publication activity demonstrates that **research into quantum computers and simulators has dramatically increased over the last five years with a variety of academic institutions and companies active across the globe.**
- **The overarching vision is that quantum technology will enable fundamental breakthroughs in a number of fields** to address challenges that are currently difficult to solve. Our research shows that although being a rapidly growing area, life sciences interest in quantum computers and simulators is still relatively modest and currently focused in specific areas. Nevertheless, while there are many and divergent forecasts regarding its benefits, broadly there is consensus that quantum computers and simulators promise a multitude of opportunities in the life sciences. These include **domains such as quantum chemistry, drug design and discovery, biomolecular processes, biological optimisation, and genetics and genomics.**
- There are a series of challenges associated with the application of quantum computers and simulators to the life sciences. The realisation of many life sciences use cases will require further developments to scale up quantum computers and simulators. For example, **further developments in quantum hardware are needed, as well as the development of specialised quantum algorithms and investment in key enabling materials.** There are also challenges related to the availability and types of skills. Furthermore, **potential risks associated with the use of the technology could have ethical implications and undermine trust.**
- We outline a set of potential activities to help enable the quantum technology life sciences ecosystem in the future. Growing and nurturing the wider ecosystem will require a combination of activities, some of which are specific to the life sciences industry, and others that are more general which horizontally apply across multiple sectors. These activities are unlikely to be achieved by

governments or industry alone and **will require an active, multi-stakeholder approach**. Furthermore, given the early stage of development of quantum technologies, it is important that stakeholders involved are 'patient' and embrace a holistic, long-term approach to its adoption.


Multi-country outbreak of monkeypox, External situation report #7 - 5 October 2022

Edition 7 5 October 2022

Highlights

- During the week of 26 September to 2 October 2022, the number of monkeypox cases reported in the Regions of Europe and the Americas declined, driving the overall downward trend observed since August 2022.
- Since the last edition published on 21 September 2022, 7147 new cases (11.6% increase in total cases) and three new deaths have been reported.
- On 5 October 2022, WHO launched its Monkeypox Strategic Preparedness, Readiness and Response Plan which outlines the priority actions needed to stop human-to-human transmission of monkeypox, minimize animal-human transmission of the virus in affected countries, and protect vulnerable groups at risk of severe disease.
- WHO reiterates the importance of using standardized case and death definitions and encourages its Member States to adopt and apply the monkeypox death definition as highlighted in the latest version of the monkeypox surveillance guidance.


Weekly epidemiological update on COVID-19 – 5 October 2022

Overview

Globally, the number of new weekly cases decreased by 6% during the week of 26 September to 2 October 2022, as compared to the previous week, with over 2.9 million new cases reported. The number of new weekly deaths decreased by 12%, as compared to the previous week, with just over 8300 fatalities reported.

As of 2 October 2022, 615 million confirmed cases and 6.5 million deaths have been reported globally...

The pledging moment will provide the ideal platform for public-sector partners to also re-strengthen their support to achieving a lasting polio-free world.

:: Canada has become the first country in the world to advance to the second stage of poliovirus containment certification, with one of its designated poliovirus essential facilities receiving a Global Certification Commission-endorsed Interim Certificate of Containment (ICC). In a joint statement, the World Veterinary Association and the World Medical Association, say that dog-bite transmitted rabies is a disease of neglected populations, frequently in resource-poor areas. Most of these deaths would be avoidable if more than 70 per cent of dogs could be vaccinated and if bite victims would be properly treated through wound washing and timely post-exposure treatment. In short, the requisite tools to control rabies are currently available, however implementation of these tools is the current and greatest challenge.

Health care organizations have obligations to manage waste in ways that minimize environmental impact and express their status as good citizens of their global, domestic, and regional communities. - The impact of global health strategies is constrained by the incongruity between critical facets of cultural context, global health practitioners' inadequate understanding of the culturally-grounded worldview of communities and the strategies they develop to promote family and community well-being.
- For many years, in the field of global health, anthropologists have articulated the need for greater attention to be given to culture, however, this critical parameter continues to be neglected in research and practice.
- Predominant conceptual models of health and illness at the global level reflect Euro-centric values of individualist societies and overlook the structure and dynamics of family and community systems in non-western, collectivist cultures in the Majority World.
- Decolonization of global health requires reframing of research and interventions to ensure that they reflect the structure, roles and resources of indigenous cultures in the Global South.
- Global research and funding institutions should support more culturally-grounded research and programs to increase their relevance to local communities, their effectiveness and subsequent impact. For many years, the need for global health research and practice to give greater attention to culture has been articulated; however, this critical parameter continues to be greatly neglected.

The Lancet Commission on lessons for the future from the COVID-19 pandemic, published on Sept 15, lays bare what has been nothing less than a massive global failure—a failure of rationality, transparency, norms of public health practice, operational coordination, and international solidarity. The Commission shows that national governments were too slow and too cautious in their response to the outbreak of SARS-CoV-2. They paid too little attention to the most vulnerable groups in society. Their responses were hampered by low public trust and an epidemic of misinformation and disinformation. The result was millions of preventable deaths and a reversal in progress towards sustainable development for many countries. A multilateral system developed after the World War 2 did not hold up to a modern pandemic. Global collaboration and solidarity were good in business and science but poor in politics and international relations. The Commission proposes five pillars that are essential in fighting emerging infectious diseases: prevention, containment, health services, equity, and global innovation and diffusion. To achieve these pillars the Commission argues that governments, regulators, and institutions must be reoriented toward society as a whole, rather than the interests of individuals—a concept the Commissioners call prosociality. Without this shift, the world is vulnerable and unable to tackle effectively any global threat.

The Commission gives recommendations in three main areas. First, practical steps to finally control and understand the COVID-19 pandemic, such as a vaccination strategy that is sustainable and not just

reactive, with the goal of protecting populations. Second, realistic, feasible, and necessary investments to improve the first line of defense in countries by strengthening health systems and widening universal health coverage. Third, ambitious proposals to ignite a renaissance in multilateralism, integrating the global response to the risk of future pandemics with actions to address the climate crisis and reversals in sustainable development. In this way, the Commission boldly sets out a vision of a different future, defined by a properly financed and better-prepared global architecture that is driven by cooperation and shared responsibility rather than globalised profit-seeking...

Summary

Recognition of the importance of nutrition during middle childhood (age 5–9 years) and adolescence (age 10–19 years) is increasing, particularly in the context of global food insecurity and rising overweight and obesity rates. Prevention and treatment of infectious diseases in migrants in Europe in the era of universal health coverage

Summary

Some subpopulations of migrants to Europe are generally healthier than the population of the country of settlement, but are at increased risk of key infectious diseases, including tuberculosis, HIV, and viral hepatitis, as well as under-immunisation. Infection screening programmes across Europe work in disease silos with a focus on individual diseases at the time of arrival. We argue that European health-care practitioners and policy makers would benefit from developing a framework of universal health care for migrants, which proactively offers early testing and vaccinations by delivering multi-disease testing and catch-up vaccination programmes integrated within existing health systems. Such interventions should be codeveloped with migrant populations to overcome barriers faced in accessing services. Aligning policies with the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control guidance for health care for migrants, community-based preventive health-care programmes should be delivered as part of universal health care. However, effective implementation needs appropriate funding, and to be underpinned by high-quality evidence.

Genome-wide association studies have identified hundreds of robust genetic associations underlying psychiatric disorders and provided important biological insights into disease onset and progression. There is optimism that genetic findings will pave the way to precision psychiatry by facilitating the development of more effective treatments and the identification of groups of patients that these treatments should be targeted toward. However, there are several challenges that must be addressed before genetic findings can be translated into the clinic. In this Perspective, we highlight ten challenges for the field of psychiatric genetics, focused on the robust and generalizable detection of genetic risk factors, improved definition and assessment of psychopathology and achieving better clinical indicators. We discuss recent advancements in the field that will improve the explanatory and predictive power of genetic data and ultimately contribute to improving the management and treatment of patients with a psychiatric disorder.

Abstract

Despite the fact that we produce enough food to feed everyone on Earth, world hunger is on the rise. On the other side of the table, the obesity crisis also weighs heavily. Malnutrition is less about food than about socioeconomic factors such as conflict, poverty, and global disasters such as climate change and the novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. Nutrition and infectious disease exist in an intricate dance. Adequate and balanced nutrition is critical for appropriate response to infection and any changes in the balance can serve as a tipping point for the next pandemic. On the other hand, pandemics, such as COVID-19, lead to greater malnutrition. Both over- and undernutrition increase severity of disease, alter vaccine effectiveness, and potentially create conditions for viral mutation and adaptation—further driving the disease and famine vicious cycle. The 22 Egyptian Old Kingdom pyramids (2675–2250 BCE), notably those of the Giza plateau, were massive monuments to the kings entombed within them and to their stone quarriers, block transporters, and exact builders who were supported by the concentrated barley yields of seasonal Nile inundation agriculture—famously without the construction and manipulation of riverside canals as required in contemporary southern Mesopotamia. The mysterious mechanics of those pyramid constructions are now solved, in part, by the recent Wadi al-Jarf papyri discoveries that document contemporary Nile boat transport of stone blocks for pyramid construction from the cliffs opposite Giza and from the Red Sea (1). Today, the Nile flows more than 7 km east of the Giza pyramids. But Nile flow through a channel that linked the Giza plateau to the Nile, termed the “Khufu channel” after the famed Khufu pyramid at Giza (2,583,283 m³, 146 m high), has been hypothesized from a modern wastewater project’s corings and its 1.8-km-long trench that cut through an ancient channel—even perhaps through Khufu’s palace (2).
