[Comment by UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Türk on Brazil](#)

Statement 09 January 2023

"The scenes that unfolded on 8 January in Brazil, when thousands of supporters of the former president stormed and vandalized the headquarters of the three branches of the Brazilian State – Congress, the Federal Supreme Court and the Presidential Palace – were shocking.

I condemn this attack on the heart of Brazilian democracy. Sunday's violence was the culmination of the sustained distortion of facts and incitement to violence and hatred by political, social and economic actors who have been fuelling an atmosphere of distrust, division, and destruction by rejecting the result of democratic elections.

Accepting the outcome of free, fair and transparent elections is at the heart of fundamental democratic principles. Baseless allegations of electoral fraud undermine the right to political participation.

Disinformation and manipulation need to stop. I urge leaders from across Brazil's political spectrum to cooperate with each other to work towards restoring trust in democratic institutions, and to promote public dialogue and participation.

At least eight journalists were attacked or had their equipment destroyed, meaning they were unable to perform their essential role of informing Brazilians – and the world – about what was happening. These latest attacks confirm a trend of increasing physical aggression against journalists in a context of high levels of political violence.

I call on the authorities to hold prompt, impartial, effective and transparent investigations into Sunday's violence and bring those responsible to account.

My Office is ready to support the new Government in tackling the human rights issues Brazil is facing."

Acute Malnutrition

[Urgent action needed as acute malnutrition threatens the lives of millions of vulnerable children](#)

GENEVA, NEW YORK, ROME, 12 January 2023 - United Nations agencies **are calling for urgent action to protect the most vulnerable children in the 15 countries hardest hit by an unprecedented food and nutrition crisis.**

Conflict, climate shocks, the ongoing impacts of COVID-19, and rising costs of living are leaving increasing numbers of children acutely malnourished while key health, nutrition and other life-saving services are becoming less accessible. **Currently, more than 30 million children in the 15 worst-affected countries suffer from wasting – or acute malnutrition – and 8 million of these children are severely wasted, the deadliest form of undernutrition.** This is a major threat to children’s lives and to their long-term health and development, the impacts of which are felt by individuals, their communities, and their countries.

In response, **five UN agencies - the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the UN Refugee Agency (UNHCR), the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF), the World Food Programme (WFP) and the World Health Organization (WHO) - are calling for accelerated progress on the Global Action Plan on Child Wasting.** It aims to prevent, detect and treat acute malnutrition among children in the worst-affected countries, which are Afghanistan, Burkina Faso, Chad, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, Haiti, Kenya, Madagascar, Mali, the Niger, Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan, the Sudan and Yemen.

The Global Action Plan addresses the need for a multi-sectoral approach and highlights priority actions across maternal and child nutrition through the food, health, water and sanitation, and social protection systems. In response to increasing needs, the UN agencies identified five priority actions that will be effective in addressing acute malnutrition in countries affected by conflict and natural disasters and in humanitarian emergencies. Scaling up these actions as a coordinated package will be critical for preventing and treating acute malnutrition in children, and averting a tragic loss of life.

The UN agencies call for decisive and timely action to prevent this crisis from becoming a tragedy for the world’s most vulnerable children. All agencies urge for greater investment in support of a coordinated UN response that will meet the unprecedented needs of this growing crisis, before it is too late.



[\\$50M Gift Establishes Paul Farmer Collaborative](#)

Cummings Foundation commitment to support long-term global health alliance between Harvard Medical School and the University of Global Health Equity in Rwanda

BOSTON, Jan. 10, 2023 – A new \$50 million gift from Woburn, Mass.-based Cummings Foundation will build upon and amplify the work of late global health champion Paul Farmer.

The gift establishes the Paul Farmer Collaborative of Harvard Medical School (HMS) and University of Global Health Equity (UGHE), an initiative of Partners In Health (PIH) based in Rwanda. It will be divided equally between the two institutions.

Farmer, a physician and medical anthropologist, was the Kolokotronis University Professor at Harvard University, chair of the Department of Global Health and Social Medicine at HMS, chancellor of UGHE, and co-founder and chief strategist of Partners In Health, the international health and human rights organization. He died on Feb. 21, at age 62, while teaching at UGHE.

“During his all-too-brief time here with us, Paul was the vital physical link between Harvard and UGHE,” said Joyce Cummings, who co-founded Cummings Foundation with her husband, suburban Boston real

estate magnate Bill Cummings. "In Paul's absence, it is critical that we act to ensure that this bond and his work endure."

The Paul Farmer Collaborative

The gift is intended to build on Farmer's legacy and **enable researchers at both institutions to deepen their exploration of social medicine**, a field focused on the many factors influencing a person's health, and pursue fundamental questions about social determinants of health and humane caregiving. **The overarching goal of the collaborative is to catalyze the development of sustainable, equitable health systems that improve health care delivery to underserved populations.**

The program, named in Farmer's honor, will build on existing multifaceted collaborations between HMS and UGHE. Cummings Foundation's contribution, which will be paid over 10 years, will fund:

- Independent and collaborative research, teaching, and education at both institutions.
- Exchange of students, postdoctoral trainees, and faculty between the two institutions.
- An annual global conference and workshop on health equity, global health delivery, research, education, and social medicine.
- An endowed Cummings Foundation Professorship of Global Health Equity at HMS to continue advancing Farmer's ideals and objectives.
- Clinical training opportunities for medical students and residents with an initial focus on building surgical capacity and surgical health innovation in low-resource settings. Long term, the training could expand to include other clinical specialties such as mental health, obstetrics, gynecology, pediatrics, internal medicine, dermatology, and anesthesiology.

"This gift will allow us to continue Paul's transformative work and honor his vision to reshape health care delivery for marginalized populations and to connect HMS with the University of Global Health Equity," said HMS Dean George Q. Daley. "This gift is a powerful reminder that as a global community, we are only as strong as the most vulnerable among us, which Paul understood better than anyone."

In dollars and time commitment, the gift represents one of the most significant relationships that HMS has in Africa...

"UGHE is training a new generation of leaders who will bring together the best evidence and a strong commitment to equity to improve health systems in East Africa and beyond," said Jim Yong Kim, co-founder of Partners In Health and newly appointed successor to Farmer as chancellor of UGHE. Kim previously served as president of the World Bank and of Dartmouth College. Like Farmer, he earned his MD and PhD at HMS and served as chair of its Department of Global Health and Social Medicine.

Created by Partners In Health, UGHE was launched in 2015 with substantial support from Cummings Foundation, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and the Republic of Rwanda.

The government donated land for the magnificent rural campus, plus major new roadways and improved access to water, electricity, and internet connectivity...

Support for UGHE has grown significantly in recent years, with the largest donations coming from Cummings Foundation and Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Up until this year, Cummings Foundation has contributed more than \$27.5 million to UGHE, while the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has donated more than \$18.5 million to help establish the university's flagship degree programs.

In September 2022, the Gates Foundation committed \$50 million to the Paul E. Farmer Scholarship Fund at UGHE, which will cover the tuition, room, board and expenses of 3,000 students over the next 25 years...

Executive Summary

The first years of this decade have heralded a particularly disruptive period in human history. The return to a “new normal” following the COVID-19 pandemic was quickly disrupted by the outbreak of war in Ukraine, ushering in a fresh series of crises in food and energy – triggering problems that decades of progress had sought to solve.

As 2023 begins, the world is facing a set of risks that feel both wholly new and eerily familiar. **We have seen a return of “older” risks** – inflation, cost-of-living crises, trade wars, capital outflows from emerging markets, widespread social unrest, geopolitical confrontation and the spectre of nuclear warfare – which few of this generation’s business leaders and public policy-makers have experienced.

These are being amplified by comparatively new developments in the global risks landscape, including unsustainable levels of debt, a new era of low growth, low global investment and de-globalization, a decline in human development after decades of progress, **rapid and unconstrained development of dual-use (civilian and military) technologies**, and the growing pressure of climate change impacts and ambitions in an ever-shrinking window for transition to a 1.5°C world.


Together, these are converging to shape a unique, uncertain and turbulent decade to come.

The Global Risks Report 2023 presents the results of the latest Global Risks Perception Survey (GRPS). We use three time frames for understanding global risks.

- Chapter 1 considers the mounting impact of current crises (i.e. global risks which are already unfolding) on the most severe global risks that many expect to play out over the short term (two years).
- Chapter 2 considers a selection of risks that are likely to be most severe in the long term (10 years), exploring newly emerging or rapidly accelerating economic, environmental, societal, geopolitical and technological risks that could become tomorrow’s crises.
- Chapter 3 imagines mid-term futures, exploring how connections between the emerging risks outlined in previous sections may collectively evolve into a “polycrisis” centred around natural resource shortages by 2030. The report concludes by considering perceptions of the comparative state of preparedness for these risks and highlighting enablers to charting a course to a more resilient world...

AI Research Ethics

Executive summary

Research in the fields of artificial intelligence (AI) and data science is often quickly turned into products and services that affect the lives of people around the world. Research in these fields is used in the provision of public services like social care, determining which information is amplified on social media, what jobs or insurance people are offered, and even who is deemed a risk to the public by police and security services. **There has been a significant increase in the volume of AI and data science research in the last ten years, with these methods now being applied to other scientific domains like history, economics, health sciences and physics.**

Globally, the volume of AI research is increasing year-on-year and currently accounts for more than 4% of all published research.

Since products and services built with AI and data science research can have substantial effects on people's lives, it is essential that this research is conducted safely and responsibly, and with due consideration for the broader societal impacts it may have. However, **the traditional research**

governance mechanisms that are responsible for identifying and mitigating ethical and societal risks often do not address the challenges presented by AI and data science research.

As several prominent researchers have highlighted,² inadequately reviewed AI and data science research can create risks that are carried downstream into subsequent products,³ services and research.⁴ Studies have shown these risks can disproportionately impact people from marginalised and minoritised communities, exacerbating racial and societal inequalities.⁵ If left unaddressed, unexamined assumptions and unintended consequences (paid forward into deployment as 'ethical debt'⁶) can lead to significant harms to individuals and society. These harms can be challenging to address or mitigate after the fact...

In many corporate and academic research institutions, one of the primary mechanisms for assessing and mitigating ethical risks is the use of Research Ethics Committees (RECs), also known in some regions as Institutional Review Boards (IRBs) or Ethics Review Committees (ERCs). Since the 1960s, these committees have been empowered to review research before it is undertaken and can reject proposals unless changes are made in the proposed research design.

RECs generally consist of members of a specific academic department or corporate institution, who are tasked with evaluating research proposals before the research begins. Their evaluations are based on a combination of normative and legal principles that have developed over time, originally in relation to biomedical human subjects research. A REC's role is to help ensure that researchers justify their decisions for how research is conducted, thereby mitigating the potential harms they may pose.

However, **the current role, scope and function of most academic and corporate RECs are insufficient for the myriad of ethical challenges that AI and data science research can pose.** For example, the scope of REC reviews is traditionally only on research involving human subjects. This means that the many AI and data science projects that are not considered a form of direct intervention in the body or life of an individual human subject are **exempt from many research ethics review processes.**⁹ In addition, a significant amount of AI and data science research involves the use of publicly available and repurposed datasets, which are considered exempt from ethics review under many current research ethics guidelines.¹⁰

If AI and data science research is to be done safely and responsibly, RECs must be equipped to examine the full spectrum of risks, harms and impacts that can arise in these fields.

In this report, we explore the role that academic and corporate RECs play in evaluating AI and data science research for ethical issues, and also investigate the kinds of common challenges these bodies face. The report draws on two main sources of evidence: a review of existing literature on RECs and research ethics challenges, and a series of workshops and interviews with members of RECs and researchers who work on AI and data science ethics.

COVID – China Focus

China reports almost 60,000 Covid-related deaths in a month

Beijing releases latest figures after facing earlier criticism for underplaying severity of outbreak

Chinese authorities reported nearly 60,000 Covid-related deaths at hospitals across the country since the end of strict pandemic restrictions in December, following criticism from groups including the World Health Organization for underrepresenting the severity of its outbreak.

Jiao Yahui, director of the medical affairs department for China’s National Health Commission, said there had been a total of 59,938 deaths related to Covid-19 infections at Chinese hospitals between December 8 and January 12, according to state media reports on Saturday.

“Owing to the relatively large amount of data and information, in order to reflect the mortality situation [for Covid-19] in China scientifically, objectively and realistically . . . we organised experts to conduct a systematic analysis of fatality cases, which took a long time,” Jiao said.

The publication of a sum total for Covid-related deaths at hospitals stops short of providing comprehensive mortality figures for the disease, after health officials narrowed the definition of Covid deaths and cases. Beijing had reported limited fatality data since December 7, when Chinese authorities announced significant relaxations to President Xi Jinping’s “zero-Covid” pandemic policy, which had slowed economic growth...

...Internal Chinese government estimates indicated that about 250mn people, or about a fifth of China’s population, may have been infected by late December. The official figures released on Saturday by China’s NHC showed about 5,500 deaths from respiratory failure caused by Covid-19 infections, and another 54,400 deaths from infection combined with underlying health conditions.

The average age of fatalities was just over 80 years old, with more than 90 per cent of those who died aged 65 or over.



Weekly epidemiological update on COVID-19 - 11 January 2023

Overview

Globally, nearly 2.9 million new cases and over 11 000 deaths were reported in the week of 2 to 8 January 2023. This represents a reduction in weekly cases and deaths of 9% and 12%, respectively. In the last 28 days (12 December 2022 to 8 January 2023), over 13.9 million cases and over 49 000 new deaths were reported globally – an increase of 10% and 22% respectively, compared to the previous 28 days. As of 8 January 2023, over 659 million confirmed cases and over 6.6 million deaths have been reported globally...

Polio

Polio this week as of 11 January 2023 - GPEI

- Ahead of the WHO Executive Board that is scheduled to take place from 30 January to 7 February 2023, the Secretariat has prepared two reports which will inform Member State discussions, namely on [polio eradication](#) and on [polio transition planning and post-certification](#). On polio eradication, the report provides an update on work towards fully implementing and financing all aspects of the Polio Eradication Strategy 2022–2026, which received support at the Seventy-fifth World Health Assembly. The polio transition planning and polio post-certification report provides an update on the implementation of the Strategic Action Plan on Polio Transition (2018–2023), with a focus on steps being taken by the Secretariat in 2023 to respond to the recommendations of the [mid-term evaluation of the Strategic Action Plan](#), and on progress at the country level.
- 13 January 2023 marks 12 years since the last case of wild poliovirus in India – a remarkable public health success. [“It seemed impossible until it was done!”](#) – Dr Hamid Jafari, Director of Polio for WHO’s Eastern Mediterranean Region, reflects on his time eradicating polio in India and what lessons we can take from this to address the final challenges for achieving eradication in Afghanistan and Pakistan.
- Well-known science educator Hank Green discusses polio’s rise to explosive outbreaks in the 1950s and the ensuing development of the inactivated and oral vaccines in [this educational video on polio eradication](#). The clip looks positively upon OPV, while recognizing its drawbacks and the GPEI’s plan to switch to exclusive IPV use in the next few years. Vaccine-derived polio and “the switch” are also discussed, accompanied by on-message explanations. Though Green does not cover nOPV2, the video gives a very good historical and scientific overview of the existing polio vaccines, their strengths against various types of polioviruses, and some of the challenges and promises of eradication.

- No region is close to being self-sufficient. Every region relies on trade with others for more than 25 percent of at least one important type of good.
- About 40 percent of global trade is "concentrated." Importing economies rely on three or fewer nations for this share of global trade.
- Three-quarters of this concentration comes from economy-specific choices. In these cases (30 percent of global trade), individual countries source a product from only a few nations, even when global supply options are diversified.
- Over the past five years, the largest economies have not systematically diversified the origins of imports. All have vulnerabilities, some more than others.
- Informed reimagination of global trade requires a granular approach, both in mapping concentrated trade relationships and in deciding on action—whether to double down, decouple, or diversify.

[China: Law on the Protection of Women's Rights and Interests Revised](#)

On October 30, 2022, the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, China's highest legislative body, approved a revision of the Law on the Protection of Women's Rights and Interests (unofficial English translation). The new law took effect on January 1, 2023. Before this current comprehensive revision, the law had been amended in 2005 and then slightly modified in 2018.

The revision expands the previous law from 61 articles in nine chapters to 86 articles in 10 chapters. It aims to promote gender equality in a variety of areas, including women's political rights, personality rights, cultural and educational rights, employment, property rights, and rights and interests related to marriage and family. It also provides relief measures for women whose rights have been harmed.

Summary

When the history of the COVID-19 pandemic is written, the failure of many states to live up to their human rights obligations should be a central narrative. The pandemic began with Wuhan officials in China suppressing information, silencing whistleblowers, and violating the freedom of expression and the right to health. Since then, COVID-19's effects have been profoundly unequal, both nationally and globally. These inequalities have emphatically highlighted how far countries are from meeting the supreme human rights command of non-discrimination, from achieving the highest attainable standard of health that is equally the right of all people everywhere, and from taking the human rights obligation of international assistance and cooperation seriously. We propose embedding human rights and equity within a transformed global health architecture as the necessary response to COVID-19's rights violations. This means vastly more funding from high-income countries to support low-income and middle-income countries in rights-based recoveries, plus implementing measures to ensure equitable distribution of COVID-19 medical technologies. We also emphasise structured approaches to funding and equitable distribution going forward, which includes embedding human rights into a new pandemic treaty. Above all, new legal instruments and mechanisms, from a right to health treaty to a fund for civil society right to health advocacy, are required so that the narratives of future health emergencies—and people's daily lives—are ones of equality and human rights.
